A. Opening Session with Welcome Remarks

Co-Chair, Mr. Hotta Hiro and Co-Chair, Prof. Kanchana Kanchanasut opened the session by welcoming all the participants and the presenters. There were altogether 26 participants (annex 2) and 11 presenters at the meeting.

1. Brief Report on the 16th APNG Camp by Sunyoung Yang, APNG Camp Chair and Khan Md Mahfuzus Salam, APNG Camp Co-Chair.

They presented a brief report on the 16th APNG Camp, which was from February 23rd to 25th, 2024, in collaboration with Kasetsart University with total 70 participants from 18 countries. The 17th Annual APNG Camp in 2025 will be in Japan.

2. Asia-Pacific Internet Engineering by Husni Thamrin, Keio University, Japan

Husni presented on APIE Program, objectives, and accomplishments of APIE camps, courses, internship program development, etc. from 2022 – 2023. He also reports APIE activities plan and program design in 2024.

3. APNIC Foundation projects update by Sylvia Cadena, APNIC Foundation

Sylvia Cadena's presentation highlighted the crucial role of the Asia Pacific Network Information Center (APNIC) as a neutral, independent, not-for-profit organization dedicated to managing Internet resources in the APAC region. The foundation team envisions a global, open, stable, and secure Internet, working towards this through infrastructure, inclusion, and knowledge programs. Sylvia emphasized APNIC's commitment to increasing investment in Internet development, showcasing specific initiatives in Afghanistan and efforts to promote gender and diversity inclusion. The presentation showcased tangible outcomes, such as technical training for Afghan professionals, support for internet governance forums, and the successful Switch! program promoting gender diversity across various countries in the Asia Pacific region. APNIC's commitment to building technical skills and fostering an open, stable, and secure Internet for the entire region was evident throughout the presentation.

4. APRICOT 2024 Update by Philip Smith, APNOG

Philip Smith has just informed us about the increased number of participants in the latest APRICOT compared to previous editions. He expressed gratitude to Prof. Kanchana Kanchansut and THNIC for their assistance in organizing the event, including the preparation and technical aspects.

5. intERLab Updates Research on IoT, PM2.5 and Forest Fire by Adisorn Lertsinsrubtavee. He also presented on intERLab's Training Updates, current Activities and introducing SEA-HAZEMON project: Real-time Air Quality Monitoring and Forest Fire Detection Platform and ongoing research.

Prof. Kanchana reports on the financial statement of AP* Retreat Secretariate in 2023. intERLab takes responsibility as AP* Secretariate from 2000 and now it is time to hand over this work to other organization who accept to take this role.

11. Presentation from JPNIC - Japan Network Information Center - MAEMURA Akinori Maemura

Akinori presented on the effort to combat against Manga piracy, comprehensive countermeasure line up against the piracies on the internet (whole shape), endeavors by multistakeholder "flight against piracy" team and call for cooperation to address the piracy.
